#### JOIN REFLECTIONS

Reflection is a webcommunity about yourself, how other people perceive you and how you perceive other people.

### The website contains:

- **Account**: Here the user describes himself and the information is stored for future use. Also he chooses his topic/surrounding and the group he wants to join.
- **Chat**: Five members discuss about a chosen topic and evaluate each other.
- **Forum**: This is the community:
  - <u>Private room</u>: Members can meet and talk here privately either before the play or after.
  - Open Forum: Everybody can talk to everybody.
  - Help: Talk with a psychologist
  - Vote for a gamemaster: Who is your favourite gamehost? (gallery of the hosts and link to the stats)
  - o TV-Show:
    - Guess and evaluate: Guess who is who in the TV-Show!
    - Apply: Become a candidat! The only possibility to apply is on the website. Candidates will be picked randomly.
    - Vote studio set: Which studio set should be used in next month's show?
- **Stats**: Here are stored the results of the evaluations.

## **Technical details:**

- Produced in Flash
- The chatroom is visualized in 2-D.

## TV Show

### Content:

The TV-Show is a transfer of the online-chat to TV. Candidates discuss a topic in the studio. It's the same procedure of the game/discussion as in the web.

### Genre:

- Talk-Show, one moderator and five candidates, live-audience
- The Show lasts 30 minutes and is shown once a week.

# Synergy:

- The studio set is chosen on the website every month.
- The candidates are casted out of the webcommunity.

### Interaction:

- The audience is included in the "Who is Who?" voting and is invited to write a description about how they perceived the candidates (studio device/ telephone / web).
- The progression of the voting is displayed above the candidates (only visible for the audience).
